

Bachelor's Degree Programme for Applied Cultural Studies (2006)

Specific objectives of the programme

The Applied Cultural Studies programme at Klagenfurt University combines appropriate levels of English, a Romance language and a Slavonic language with a broad knowledge of culture, including the theoretical and methodological foundations of cultural studies and the practical mediation skills relevant to cultural management.

Structure of the programme

The programme is divided into an orientation period lasting two semesters and one stage lasting four semesters. The required subjects focus on three fields: languages (English as the language of media and business and basic knowledge of a Romance and a Slavonic language); the theoretical foundations of Cultural Studies; Aspects of Culture and Cultural Management. Most modules for the compulsory electives and optional subjects should be taken from Cultural Studies while some may be taken from other programmes and courses (e.g. peace research, feminist and gender studies, intercultural communication, multilingualism, regional studies). Students may also do work placements or study abroad to improve their knowledge in individual areas.

Examination regulations

The examinations in the individual modules are either taken as part of individual courses (course examinations) or as modular examinations. The topics of the two substantial bachelor's papers are selected from the required subjects and electives (Cultural Studies and Cultural Management modules).
